Photo ID Cards


ID cards will be available for pre-order!

These cards are pre-paid at Student Services in the Book Shop. Cost for ID cards is \$15.00. (Eftpos or cash, please try to bring the correct amount, thanks)

We recommend buying an ID card for getting student rates for the bus and train etc. It is valid through March 2025.

Photo ID cards can be used for proof of identity, especially when applying for jobs and drivers licence tests, opening bank accounts and other discounts for students. The ID card order is placed once the school photos have been taken later this term. The production of ID cards can take a few weeks as they are created elsewhere.

The whanau teachers will be notified when the card is ready to be collected.



Year 13 Graduation

Requirements of Graduation from Ōtāhuhu College

A graduation student from Ōtāhuhu College must meet the following requirements by 31 October of their Year 13:

- NCEA Level 2
- 5 credits each, in a minimum of four Level 3 subjects
- A minimum engagement score of 2.5 out of five across all subjects for the year.
- Minimum of 70% attendance as measured by half days for the year. (Attendance criteria is based on Ministry of Education definition of Chronically absent being 70% half days)

To be able to Graduate the student must also:

- Submit for all external assessments.
- 100% attendance for both school and NCEA examinations

Curriculum News

Year 11

Like many other top schools, we are looking at how changes to NCEA can best benefit our students. Currently 85% of our leavers gain Level 2 or higher.

Course design

- The purpose of Year 11 is to provide students with the depth of understanding and the skills to successfully cope with Level 2 and 3 in following years.
- Each subject will offer one Level One standard (in exceptional circumstances dispensation may be granted by the Principal to offer more).
- Subjects may offer 1-2 Level 2 standards in Year 11

Creating more time for teaching and reducing the workload for staff and students will allow for a greater depth of understanding and better prepare our students for NCEA at Levels Two and Three.

Passing Year 11 in 2024

- Literacy and Numeracy
- 80% half day present or more
- Engagement grade average of 3 or more
- Participation in extra curricular activities

Passing with Distinction

- Literacy and Numeracy
- 90% half day present or more
- Engagement grade average of 4 or more
- Participation in extra curricular activities
- Merit and Excellence Level Pass in all subjects


Students who pass will be acknowledged in the Senior Assembly at the end of the year. Feel free to contact Mr Watson if you would like to discuss further.


Kotuku Unit
