French Visitors to Ōtāhuhu College

Year 11 French was very fortunate to receive a visit by two university students from France. Having arrived in Auckland only recently, Baptiste and Maëlle came and spoke with the class about their own backgrounds and the regions of France they call home, sharing the type of knowledge only locals can! The class was interested to think about the similarities and differences between life in France and life in our part of the world. Our students also gained a wider perspective on career opportunities and university study internationally when they heard about Baptiste and Maëlle's areas of study: engineering and architecture. Then, the visitors teamed up with groups of students to support them with their language learning through writing and speaking tasks. The students greatly benefitted from hearing the two new French voices, accents, and turns of phrase.
