FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

On Wednesday we held our annual ANZAC assembly, our chance to reflect and remember those students who paid the ultimate sacrifice in the service of their country.

The focus next week will be on engagement in lessons. In class and assembly, we will talk about the importance of answering questions, asking questions, discussing the work and what is being taught in class. It is great to see going around classes that students are getting better and better at this, their written work is also improving, with answers showing greater detail and more thought. This is all really good. An area we do need to work on is continuing these habits on into homework. Doing regular homework is essential for students to succeed at the level they can achieve.

Enrolments for next year are coming in at a steady rate. This year we have had to stop taking out of zone enrolments, so it is important that all families and friends enrol as soon as possible to guarantee a place for next year.





Our Commitments

Each week our students receive an engagement grade based on a 1 to 5 scale. To get a 5, students need to attempt all classwork and homework, and consistently strive to produce work at or above the level expected from this pupil as indicated by past academic results. You can help by encouraging your child to do homework work, and independent study. Encourage your child to always participate in class discussions, by volunteering to ask and answer questions.

Study News

Common Assessment Activities (CAAs) will be run in the hall in week 4 this term from Monday May 20th for NCEA numeracy and level 1 literacy.

To support our students who are sitting their CAAs, the English and Math departments are running after school sessions as follows.

Literacy:

After school on Thursday 2nd, Wednesday 8th, Thursday 16th and Thursday 23rd, from 3:00pm in M5 with Ms Norgate.

Numeracy:

After school on Tuesdays from 7th – 21st May from 3:00pm in T2 with Ms Channer.

This opportunity is for all students sitting their CAAs. Year 12 and Year 13 students who do not have numeracy and / or Level 1 Literacy yet, are strongly encouraged to attend.



In other news, seniors are well underway with progressing toward their NCEA qualifications and achieving UE@OC.

- Year 11s are working towards achieving 10 numeracy and 10 Level 1 literacy credits.
- Year 12s are working towards achieving UE literacy and 60 credits at Level 2 or above, targeting Merit and Excellence
- Year 13s are working towards achieving UE literacy and 60 credits at Level 3 or above, targeting Merit and Excellence, and a minimum of 14 credits in at least 3 university approved subjects.

Parents and Guardians please talk to your child about:

- How many credits they currently have.
- Which credits they have (for example, numeracy, UE literacy, Level 2 or 3).
- How many credits they need and how they will get them.

If your child seems unsure about where they are currently at and where they are headed, regarding their school qualification, please book a Parent-Teacher meeting with me (instructions outlined above).
